

<p>Pursuant to Article 13 and 14 of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation), hereinafter referred to as the "GDPR", we inform that:</p>	
I. Personal data controller	The controller of personal data is PGE Polska Grupa Energetyczna S.A. (hereinafter " PGE S.A. ") with its registered office in: 20-718 Lublin, Aleja Kraśnicka 27 . II. Data Protection Officer	The designated Data Protection Officer can be contacted on personal data protection at the following email address: iod.pgesa@gkpge.pl or in writing to the aforementioned mailing address of the Controller.
III. Purpose and basis of processing	<p>Your personal data will be processed on the basis of:</p> <p>Article 6(1)(f) of the GDPR - the processing is necessary for the purposes of the Controller's legitimate interests, for:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. handling correspondence, answering your questions sent by electronic mail; 2. managing stakeholder relations on regulatory issues at international level, including lobbying activities; 3. sending invitations to organised events for the purpose of conducting promotional activities of PGE S.A.; 4. archiving purposes (evidence) as an implementation of protecting information in the event of a legal need to prove facts; 5. potential determining, investigation or defence against claims being the fulfilment of the legally justified interest of PGE S.A. <p>Article 6(1)(a) of the GDPR - voluntary consent to the processing of personal data expressed, in particular, through the provision of your contact data in the form of a traditional or electronic business card, the exchange of contact data with the representative of the PGE Office in Brussels or registration for a conference/professional meeting or other event organised by PGE S.A. in order to maintain contact with the PGE S.A. Office in Brussels, including, among others, participation in activities organised by the Office.</p>
IV. Withdrawal of the consent	You have the right to withdraw your consent to data processing at any time. If you exercise this right, the Controller will cease processing your data and your personal data will be deleted in accordance with the request received. The processing of data prior to the withdrawal of the consent will remain legally binding. The withdrawal of the consent can be reported to the email address: biurobruksela.pgesa@gkpge.pl or to the Controller's mailing address.
V. Categories of data	Basic data / Identification data (so-called ordinary data: name and surname, telephone number, e-mail address, place of work, position).
VI. Source of data origin	Personal data has been collected directly from you, or from the person/institution you represent, or from publicly available sources such as websites, industry conferences, business meetings.
VII. Period of data processing	<p>The period of the processing of your personal data is related to the purposes indicated above.</p> <p>In view of the foregoing, your personal data will be processed until you object to the processing or until you withdraw your consent to further processing or until the purpose of the processing is fulfilled.</p>

VIII. Data recipients	<p>Your personal data may be transferred to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Institutions authorised by law; 2. PGE Group entities, PGE partners; 3. Our subcontractors and service providers (processors).
IX. Data transfer outside the EEA	<p>In principle, your personal data will not be transferred outside the European Economic Area (hereinafter: the "EEA"). However, taking into account the operation of IT infrastructure and ICT services provided by PGE Systemy S.A. as a Processor, whose selected subcontractors operate outside the EEA, the above circumstances may result in the transfer of your data outside the EEA. In each case, the transfer of data is based on the legal basis arising from Article 46(2) of GDPR.</p>
X. Rights of the data subject	<p>Under the GDPR, you have the right to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. access and receive a copy of your data; 2. have your data rectified (amended); 3. request erasure, restriction of processing or to object to processing; 4. data portability; 5. lodge a complaint to the supervision authority - the President of the Office for Personal Data Protection. XI. Right to object	<p>You have the right to object at any time to the processing of your data processed for the legitimate interest of the controller as indicated in clause III (i.e. under Article 6(1)(f)). The controller will cease processing the data for these purposes unless the controller can demonstrate compelling legitimate grounds that override your interests, rights and freedoms or the data are necessary for the establishment, exercise or defence of claims.</p>
XII. Information about the voluntary provision of the data	<p>Where personal data is obtained directly from you, the provision of personal data is voluntary, but failure to do so will prevent you from fulfilling the purposes indicated in clause III above.</p>
XIII. Automated decision-making and profiling	<p>We will not use your data in automated decision-making and profiling processes.</p>
